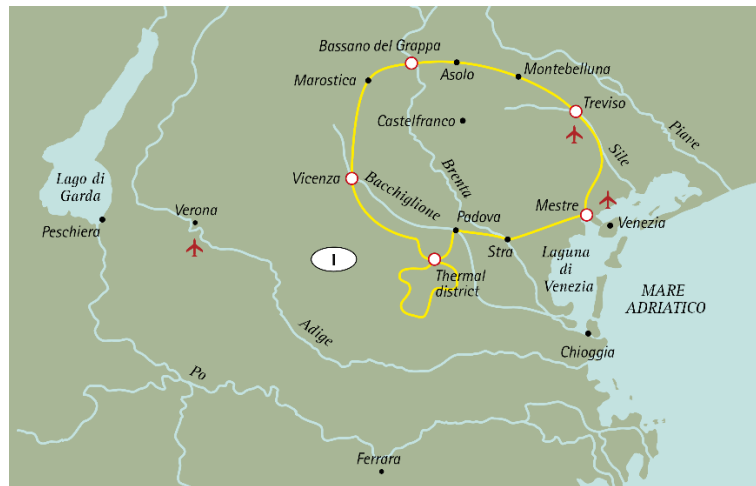


Cycling Safaris

VENICE LANDS TOUR 2026

Self-Guided

225-315 km | 7 nights / 8 days



This is the new Venice Lands tour. It starts and ends in Mestre (Venice mainland) and has 2 overnights in Galzignano.

Nestled between the Alps and the Adriatic Sea this tour explores the Veneto (Venetia) region of northern Italy. This area has always had a key strategic significance, its location forming a gateway between the Mediterranean region and northern and eastern Europe.

Pedalling through vineyards, mountain backdrops and on two tiny islands, this journey brings you through a lovely mixture of scenery and explores some of Italy's true classics.

We cycle along lagoons, rivers and the sea, through quiet planes and bustling towns, and experience a unique fusion between the old and new Italy.

The region being the birthplace of the famous architect Andrea Palladio (16th Century) you are spoilt for stunning architecture that characterises the beautiful villages and also the many "Palladio Villas" along the way.

Highlights:

- Two overnights in the Euganean Hills, Europe's largest spa area
- The city of the famous Renaissance architect Palladio: Vicenza
- A taste of grappa, a popular distilled spirit produced from gape pomace in Bassano

What awaits you:

An easy week of leisurely cycling suitable for everyone. The route is mostly flat, except for a one kilometer climb to Asolo and a few short ups and downs. You'll ride on low-traffic secondary roads and paved bike paths. Greater care should be taken when entering and leaving cities, as there may be a bit more traffic, especially near Treviso.

TOUR ITINERARY

Day 1 Arrival in Mestre/Venice mainland

Individual arrival and overnight.

Day 2 Mestre/Venice mainland - Padua thermal district (55 km / +240m -235m)

You will start following the Brenta Canal, overlooked by the countryside villas of the ancient Venetian nobility (Villa Malcontenta, Villa Widmann, Villa Pisani) until you reach the hamlet of Stra. From here you will cycle along the Piovego Canal, which will lead you to the city centre of Padua, home to one of the oldest Italian (and European) universities and rich in art and history. Finally, along the cycle path of the Battaglia canal, you will head towards the Euganean Hills, where you will have the chance to relax in the largest European thermal district.



Day 3 Padua thermal district loop (45 km / +320m -320m)

Discover the Regional Park of the Euganean Hills and its wonderful sights. You will first stop in the gardens of Villa Barbarigo in Valsanzibio, one of the most important examples of classical Italian garden (with a real labyrinth, too) and then visit the medieval towns of Arquà Petrarca and Monselice with its town walls. Along the cycle path of the Vigenzone canal you will reach the hamlet of Pontemanco with its mills and then you will continue through Mezzavia, where the Castle of San Pelagio hosts the Air Museum with the history of the human flight, from Leonardo da Vinci to the Mongolfier brothers, to Neil Armstrong. Cycling back do not miss the visit of the Catajo Castle.

Day 4 Padua thermal district - Vicenza (50 km / +255m -215m)

Cycling out of the Euganean Hills, you will head towards the cycle path of the river Bacchiglione, which will lead you into Vicenza, architect Palladio's personal showcase. Before entering the town, along the way you can admire the Palladian masterpiece Villa La Rotonda. Let yourself be fascinated by the old city centre of Vicenza, characterized by beautiful private palaces and public buildings by Andrea Palladio.

Day 5 Vicenza - Bassano del Grappa (40 km / +255m -185m)

From Vicenza you will cycle towards Marostica, famous for its castle and the chessboard on the main square. Today's destination is Bassano known for the famous drink "grappa" and for the "Ponte Vecchio," also known as the Bridge of the Alpini. This is a historic covered wooden bridge, which spans the Brenta River in the center of the city.



Day 6 Bassano del Grappa - Treviso (65 km / +395m -490m)

You will enter Asolo, which represents the only real uphill section of this ride. The downhill run will take you to the land of Prosecco vineyards, inscribed on the World Heritage List as a cultural landscape. In Maser you can admire another Palladian masterpiece, Villa Barbaro, frescoed by Paolo Veronese, until you reach Treviso, whose city centre is characterised by ancient waterways.

Day 7 Treviso-Mestre/Venice mainland (45 km / +190m -210m)

Leaving Treviso behind you, you will follow the course of the River Sile up to Casale. Don't miss the striking Cimitero dei Burci (ship graveyard) in Casier, where you can admire the half-sunken remains of these large wooden boats, used until the 1970s to transport goods along the Sile. At the end of the trip Venice will await you for an evening among canals and narrow streets. Accommodation is in Mestre, Venice mainland

Day 8 Mestre/Venice mainland

Departure after breakfast.

WHAT THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES

- 7 nights ensuite accommodation
- 7x breakfast (usually continental breakfast and some smaller hotels have the typical Italian breakfast consisting of a hot drink with fresh pastries such as cake, croissants or toast and jam)
- App including maps, roadbook, points of interest and GPS tracks
- Digital tour information
- Luggage transportation (1 bag per person, max. 20 kg)
- Ice cream in the best ice cream parlour in Vicenza
- Wine and oil tasting in Arquà Petrarca
- Assistance: contact phone number you can call during the tour in case of emergency

Not included:

- Helmets are **not** included in the price, but are available at time of booking for €15.
Helmets need to be booked in advance!
- Local hotel taxes to be paid on the spot (approx €15-€20 in total, to be paid on side)
- Everything not mentioned in section “included”
- Mandatory registration for Access Fee for the ancient city of Venice (to be paid on side)
- Travel to and from start and finish point

Category A: The accommodation is mainly in 4 * Hotels, with some 3* Hotels

Category B: The accommodation is mainly in 3 * Hotels

WHAT TO BRING

- Waterproof windbreaker or poncho (recommended in spring time)
- Sunglasses and Hat
- High protection sun cream and after sun cream
- Insect repellent
- Casual clothes for evening. You may be grateful for something warm with long sleeves.
- We strongly recommend to bring your own reusable water bottle with you
- We suggest to bring a holder for your mobile phone to be fixed on the handlebar, as well as a power bank (even if the App can be used offline, too)

BACK UP SERVICE

As this is a self led trip you do not have the back-up of a guide and support van. Our aim is to allow you feel like an independent traveller, free to cycle each day at your own pace while at the same time having the security of knowing that your luggage will be waiting for you in your next accommodation.

If you experience small problems with the bike (e.g., a puncture) you will have a spare tube, pump and tyre lever. You also have access to a 24 hour helpline.

Route profile

- Level: medium-easy
- Total length: 300 km
- Terrain: 80% tarmac, 20% unpaved
- Train connection among the overnight stays: day 5, 6 and 7
- Possibility to shorten the itinerary by taking the train: day 2 and 7

BIKE / FITNESS

Bike hire is not included in the tour package.

When booking you can also rent helmets (€15), suitable for head circumferences from 54 to 61 cm. All helmets have a certification mark according to the DIN EN 1078 (CE) European norm.

Level of difficulty

This is ultimately a relaxing tour with easy cycling on all stages, which gives you the opportunity to take in the surroundings. The only climb on the tour is on day 3 with the 1km slope in Asolo.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

It is up to you to make your way to and from the tour.

The starting point of Vicenza is well connected with the following airports: Venezia (VCE), Verona (VRN), Treviso (TSF), Bergamo (BGY-150min).

Please note the prices of public transfer tickets and timetables can change through the year.

Venezia Marco Polo Airport

ATVO provides a "Fly Bus" from the airport to the train station of Venezia Mestre. Bus departs every 25/30 minutes and journey time is approx 20 minutes. Ticket price is €3.00:

Verona Villafranca Catullo

Every 20 minutes from 6:30am to 11:35pm a bus departs from the airport to Verona Porta Nuova station.

Trains

In Italy there is a good train service offering bicycle transport. This low-cost option will allow you to reach the next city if you prefer to visit a city at your own pace instead of cycling. Train with **bicycle compartments** are in all regional trains and are indicated with a bicycle symbol on the carriage and also on the timetables on display in the station.

Tickets can be bought directly at the railway stations or at a "Tabacchi" stop, asking for a "fascia chilometrica" (per kilometre) ticket, plus a ticket for the bike. For further information on timetables and prices you can consult www.trenitalia.com.
