

Rioja – The Descent of the River Ebro Self Guided Tour 2024

289 - 370km | 8 days / 7-nights



A superb trip, following the River Ebro, the longest in Spain, as it flows from its source in the Cantabrian Mountains down to the distant Mediterranean. The very name of the Iberian Peninsula comes from this river – Iberia, the country of the Ebro. Our route follows what begins as a tiny mountain stream flowing through the green pastures of Cantabria, beautiful valleys, imposing canyons, vineyards, past pretty and unknown villages, witnessing the changes in the landscape and the river itself. Finally we arrive in La Rioja, home of the finest wines produced in Spain. A sea of vineyards dotted with ancient villages, castles and wine-producing *bodegas*, all with the limestone mountains of the Sierra de Cantabria in the background. A magnificent trip for those who wish to visit parts of Spain the tourists never see.

TOUR ITINERARY

Day 1 Transfer to Campoo

Arrival in Santander or Bilbao and transfer to our hotel in Campoo. Test bikes. That evening you will have dinner in your hotel.

Day 2 Campoo – Polientes

59km or 97 km

This stage takes us through some fabulous and unspoilt scenery. From the green mountain pastures of the Cantabrian Mountains, along the shores of the Ebro Reservoir, past the Monastery of Montesclaros surrounded by forests to finally rejoin the Ebro in the Valley of Valderredible and tonight's stop in Polientes. Those on the short version follow the river direct to Polientes. The longer version circumnavigates the Ebro Reservoir. Dinner in your hotel.

Polientes - Valle de Zamanzas

We begin by cycling through the open valley of Valderredible. Take the opportunity to visit the Romanesque church of San Martín de Elines and also the churches carved into the very rock which are so characteristic of this region. As we progress down the river, the sides of the valley begin to close in until we find ourselves in a marvellous canyon of ever-increasing dimensions, where eagles and vultures soar overhead. Stop to visit the fairytale village of Orbaneja del Castillo with its cascades running through the village. As we pass Pesquera de Ebro, the canyon of the Ebro reaches unbelievable dimensions before we finally reach our hotel in the Valle de Zamanzas. Dinner in your hotel tonight.

Day 4

Day 3

Valle de Zamanzas - Medina de Pomar

A beautiful route which follows a huge bend of the river through the most picturesque and undiscovered villages. An optional extension takes us to the dramatic village of Puentedey, built on a natural rock bridge over the River Nela. Tonight we stay in the Castillian town of Medina de Pomar with its old Jewish quarter and the castle dominating the town and the surrounding landscape. (63 km with route extension to Puentedey). Dinner tonight is in your hotel

Day 5

Medina de Pomar - Frías

From Medina, we head back to the Ebro, The route then takes us along a quiet country road running parallel to the river where the valley begins to open out again. Visit the Romanesque church of San Pedro de Tejada and soon we are cycling through yet another canyon, which then opens out into the fertile valley around Frías. This is a spectacular village built around its castle and enjoying fine views of the Ebro Valley. Our hotel is in a small village close by where you will have dinner.

Day 6

Frías - Haro

As we leave Frías / Herrán, the valley begins to close in on us again until we find ourselves in another spectacular canyon. The road runs along the shores of a reservoir surrounded by high mountains and through short tunnels carved out of the rock. The route crosses the little town of Miranda del Ebro before passing through imposing peaks that signal the gateway to the enormous open valley of La Rioja. Tonight is spent in the wine-producing village of Haro, with a chance to drink a glass or two of Rioja in its birthplace and maybe some tapas



Day 7

Haro - Laguardia

You cycle through endless vineyards and numerous picturesque villages of La Rioja, with the backdrop of the Sierra de Cantabria mountains and the Ebro never too far away. We finally reach the superb walled medieval village of Laguardia where, as in Haro, wine is almost a way of life. Short 25 km - 15 miles, Long 50 km - 31 miles

Day 8 **Departure from Laguardia**

After breakfast you will be transferred from Laguardia to Bilbao at 9am .

BACK-UP SERVICE

As this is a self led trip you do not have the back-up of a guide and support van. Equipment for touring & e-bikes

These bikes are supplied with a helmet (obligatory in Spain), rear luggage rack, choice of rear rack bag (5 litres) or a pannier (40 litres), mudguards, small front handlebar bag, odometer, basic toolkit, 1.5 litre water bottle and a lock

Equipment for road bikes

These bikes are supplied with a helmet (obligatory in Spain), small handlebar bag, odometer, pump, basic toolkit, 1.5 litre water bottle and a lock

GENERAL INFORMATION

Route Guide and Maps

You will be provided with our Route Guide which includes detailed route instructions along with interesting information on landscapes, towns and villages, monuments, alternative route suggestions, timetables for local trains and buses, tips on eating and drinking, an exhaustive gastronomic dictionary and a host of other useful information and suggestions to keep cyclists occupied. Routes are carefully described so no time is wasted on unnecessary deviations. Maps of the area are also provided to support the Route Guide.

Trips that include more than one night in the same destination include optional round rides of differing lengths for these free days so cyclists will never be at a loose end.

Weather and Climate

Many people are put off coming to Spain on a cycling holiday due to the weather. They think it's going to be just too hot – and they are probably right! During the summer months Spain is one of the hottest and driest countries in Europe with temperatures climbing up to 40°C – 105°F or even more - too much for your average cyclist.

Temperatures can vary on this trip. The initial stages are at a higher altitude and cooler. The highest temperatures in Burgos in July and August are 26 °C. The average maximum temperature in April is 13 °C and in October 16 °C.

As we descend the river towards La Rioja, temperatures rise a little and those of Logroño (capital of La Rioja) would be representative of this latter half of the trip – the average highest temperature in July and August there are 29 °C. In Logroño the average temperature in April is 16 °C and in October 19 °C.

Terrain / Gradients

Moderate cycling with some climbs as the route follows the River Ebro as it flows downstream. Some days may involve some climbing when the route moves away from the river.

Holiday extensions

Possibility of spending extra nights in Bilbao or Santander. Please email our office for more details

TRAVEL INFORMATION

Best arrival points:

Airports – Bilbao or Santander Ferry ports - Bilbao or Santander Bus / train stations - Bilbao or Santander

Please note it is more convenient to arrive in Santander and then depart from Bilbao.

The closest airport for arrival is Santander Airport and the most convenient for departure is Bilbao Airport and is preferrable. However, it may be easier for customers to book a return flight from Bilbao Airport. It is important to remember that at the end of the tour, the transfer time from Laguardia to Bilbao is 90 minutes, so if we allow for a 2-hour check in time, then it means departure time from Laguardia would be three and a half hours before flight time. Thus, departure time from Laguardia is scheduled for 9 a.m. so customers should take this into account before booking their flights.

Another option is to spend an extra night in Bilbao and visit the city and the Guggenheim Museum (Remember the museum is closed on Monday except during the months of July and August when it is open every day).

By Air

Travellers on the routes of Asturias and Cantabria and also the Rioja route generally arrive at Santander or Bilbao Airport where they are met by our pick up service. Some companies fly directly to Santander or Bilbao from the UK and other European airports.

It is often possible to take connecting flights through Spanish airports such as Madrid or Barcelona or through other European cities. Our nearest airport is Santander connecting with Madrid and Barcelona, although flights are not so frequent. RyanAir has now opened a new route from London, Stansted to Santander Airport, actually closer to our starting point in Santillana del Mar.

You may like to extend your holiday with a mini-cruise. Brittany Ferries runs a service from the UK to Santander and P & O Ferries sail from the UK to Bilbao.

Please note that we do not get involved with travel arrangements as we feel that the customer will get the best possible deal either by searching the Internet or asking the local travel agent to check all possibilities.

By Ferry

Another alternative for these routes is a mini-cruise on the ferry. P & O run a service from Portsmouth to Bilbao which takes 36 hours. Brittany Ferries sail from Plymouth to Santander. The new ferry being brought into service in 2004 will do the crossing in 19 hours. Again, we will pick you up from the Santander or Bilbao ferryports.

Most companies will allow you to transport your own bicycle - check with individual companies for their policy on this.

Trains & Buses

If you are travelling within Spain, there is an excellent network of road transport. The Spanish Intercity train service is called Renfe. The local train service along the coast of the Basque Country, Cantabria & Asturias is called FEVE. The major coach companies, depending on where you are travelling, are Alsa and Continental Auto.
