Amsterdam Super Tulip Tour 2026

Guide cycling with group | 270km | 7 nights / 8 days

Thursday arrival day



Between April and mid-May we offer special tulip tours. The program of this Super Tulip Tour is totally dedicated to this beautiful flower. You will cycle through hectares of spring flowers and tulips, learn all about growing tulips in a tulip park and of course you visit the “Keukenhof”.

The tulip originated in Turkey. The tulip bulb reached The Netherlands at the end of the 16th century. The plant became very popular (the “Tulip Mania”): In 1634 there was one single bulb that was so expensive, costing the equivalent of a whole canal side house in Amsterdam. Of course you also will visit the world-famous, 32-hectares’ park “The Keukenhof”, an expanse of wonderfully colorful fields with flowering bulbs. On Tuesday we can pay an early morning visit to the impressive flower auction at Aalsmeer. Aalsmeer controls a market share of 44% for the turnover of bulbs and tulip flowers. At midday we cycle from Amsterdam to the Zaanse Schans, a unique hamlet where people live and work, with original houses and windmills from the river Zaan area (17th century).

Around Alkmaar are the most beautiful dunes in the country. From Alkmaar to Purmerend the route leads you through the 17th century polders. When time permits you will visit a water mill. The last part of the week the green “Waterland” surrounds us, while you’re cycling through the Beemster Polder, dating from the early 17th century.

TOUR ITINERARY

Day 1: Thursday **Arrival Amsterdam, Embarkation is between 12.30pm - 1.30pm, sailing to Spaarndam and cycling to Haarlem, 15 km**

The barge is moored at the Oosterdok in central Amsterdam, near the train station. After arrival on board, you can settle in and enjoy a cup of coffee or tea.

You will first cruise through Amsterdam and over the North Sea Canal before reaching the village of Spaarndam. From here we make an easy ride into the beautiful city of Haarlem and you will see the first of many windmills. During dinner aboard the ship, the program for the next days are discussed. As on most evenings, the tour guide will take you on a walk around the city after dinner.

Day 2: Friday **Haarlem - Keukenhof - Leiden** **40 km**

Today's trip brings us through the oldest tulip fields of Holland, including a visit of the Keukenhof gardens. Arguably the most beautiful bulb park in the world, a place where the spring breaks. It is an overwhelming blaze of colour; seven million flowering tulips in a magnificent 80-acres' of traditional and modern gardening architecture. For more information about the Keukenhof you can check the following website: www.keukenhof.nl. You spend the night in Leiden, which boasts 14 museums.

Day 3: Saturday **Leiden - Kudelstaart** **45 km**

As you ride out of Leiden you continue your tour around the Haarlemmermeer. Soon you will be in an flat and green landscape where you see windmills on the horizon. In case you have a lunchstop at the other side of the bridge in Leimuider. imagine that this Haarlemmermeer polder once was the biggest lake in Holland and nicknamed 'the waterwolf'. The cyclerroute leads you through the green heart of Holland, an area characterized by small cycle paths, typical black and white cows and despite the work of mr. Leeghwater, a lot of water. Your destination for today is Kudelstaart: a small town bordered by the Westeinderplassen.

Day 4: Sunday **Kudelstaart – Wormerveer** **45 km**

We will have breakfast while sailing in the direction of Amsterdam. Between the airport of Schiphol and the city you disembark to continue your tour by bike along the river Amstel and right into the city. We take a ferry into the green again to the Zaanse Schans, a unique hamlet where people live and work, with original houses and windmills from the river Zaan area. The hamlet is dominated by operating windmills, the oldest built in 1673, for grinding mustard, spices, paint and oil and for sawing wood into planks. The village includes a clock museum, an old-fashioned grocery store, a house with period furniture, a clog maker and a cheese farm. Afterwards we head to Wormerveer.

Day 5: Monday **Wormerveer – Alkmaar** **45 km**

From Wormerveer we cycle to and through the most beautiful dunes of the Netherlands and if weather permits, we can swim in the North Sea during our lunch break at the beach. Today's overnight stay is in cheese town Alkmaar. An historic lively city with many shops, a little less than 400 heritage sites, canals and a harbour that dominate the townscape.

Day 6: Tuesday **Alkmaar – Purmerend** **45 km**

Today you can discover the origins of Beemster cheese and the birthplace of the man who defeated 'the waterwolf'. The Beemster Polder, dating from the early 17th century, is an exceptional example of reclaimed land in the Netherlands. It has preserved intact its well-ordered landscape of fields, roads, canals, dykes and settlements, laid out in accordance with classical and Renaissance planning principles. This unique features earned Beemster a UNESCO world heritage listing.

Around the Schermer and Beemster polder a lot of the original windmills used for pumping out the water are preserved.

There will be time to visit the windmills and museum at Schermerhorn and walk around the iconic village de Rijp to see the house where mr. Leegwater was born. The day ends at the former market town Purmerend.

Day 7: Wednesday **Purmerend – Amsterdam** **35/20 km**

Purmerend lies at the edge of an area called 'Waterland' where roads and water are almost on the same level. We visit the lovely villages of Zunderdorp and Ransdorp. You have the option to cycle the long route to Edam and Volendam and if time permits you can cross the lake Gouwzee to see the traditional fisherman's village Marken with its typical wooden houses.

The short route takes you via IJpendam and Watergang. The extensive network of bicycle paths ensures a relatively easy way back into the city, showing you some remarkable sites in the centre. Then it is time to say goodbye to your bike. Before the fare-well dinner you may want to go for a walk in town. Later you may want to take a canal trip or go on a city walk through the centre of the city.

The tour finishes back in Amsterdam

Day 8: Thursday **Amsterdam, end of the tour after breakfast before 10am near Central Station**

All distances are approximate. The above planned itinerary is subject to change due to changing wind and weather conditions and other unforeseen circumstances having to do with mooring requirements, etc.

ACCOMMODATION / BARGES

Our motorized passenger vessels are about 35 - 45 metres in length and are former river vessels especially converted for this kind of holiday. The barges all comply with the strict safety regulations laid down by the Dutch Shipping Inspection Authorities. On board you find a cosy dining room, a sun deck/a deck for the bicycles. All cabins are provided with running water (hot and cold), private shower and toilet, 220 voltage and central heating. There is limited storage space in the cabin. We recommend 1 suitcase per person which you can slide under the bed.

Do not expect a cruise ship with its passive luxury. The Bike & Barge Holidays are for people who really enjoy the physical activity of cycling and who value sociability more than wholesale luxury.

Allure

The MS ALLURE is a modern, converted inland waterway vessel. The ship offers a comfortable lounge/restaurant, a small bar and a sun deck.

The MS Allure sails exclusively for Cycletours Holidays. In the evenings it is possible to come together in the sitting area (air-conditioned).

There is limited WiFi on board.

The total of ten 2-bed outside cabins with ground-level beds are around 8 square meters in size.

Clair de Lune

The Clair de Lune was originally built in 1936 as a freight ship in Belgium. From 2020 the Clair de Lune sails exclusively for Cycletours in mainly France.

The Clair de Lune sails exclusively for Cycletours Holidays .In 1982 the barge was built into a passenger ship, first named 'Steile Bank' and 'Summerjazz' . Since May 2014 we named the ship 'Clair de Lune' .

Aboard there is a big and cozy salon with big windows for a perfect view. The barge is 34.15 meters long and 5.05 meters wide, which makes it possible to boat in France with its narrow locks.

Cabin Plan

3 double cabins (with double bed)

5 split level beds cabins (L-shape)

1 single cabin

All cabins are provided with:

air-conditioning,

private shower/toilet,

sink (in cabin),

central heating,

220 voltage,

windows/ portholes that open.

There is limited storage space in the cabin. We recommend 1 suitcase per person. You can slide the suitcase under the bed.



WHAT TO BRING

Specialized cycle clothing may be handy but not strictly necessary. What you do need (among other things) is the following:

- shorts/ long trousers/ track suit/ legging
- shirts/ sweater/ rain clothing
- gloves (only when you book a tour in April. It can be chilly in the morning that time of year!)
- good shoes
- sunglasses/ cap/ swimming costume
- extra towel
- soap/ insect repellent

BIKES AND CYCLING

On these tours you cycle together as a group with the guide.

Men's frame: for passengers from 4'11 to 6'8" / 150cm - 203cm

E- bikes



E-bike with integrated battery; 8 speeds. Brand Freebike.
Accessories: bike helmet, pannier bag, a good lock and a water bottle.

We advise only to rent an electric bicycle if you are used to cycle and only need electric support because of, for example, lesser condition. It is a heavy bicycle to handle (25 kg).

For passengers from 5'1 to 6'3" / 155cm - 190cm

Bike Insurance:

Bicycle insurance is included in the bike rental.

The participant is liable for damage or theft as long as the bike is not on board. The bicycle insurance covers the cost of the repair or replacement of bicycle parts in case of an accident. It also protects against theft of the bike while it was locked.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Embarkation is between 12.30pm - 1.30pm. You can recognise the barge by the banner with Cycletours written on it. After arrival there's coffee and tea on board. Other drinks are also available on cash payment.

**The mooring place of the barge in Amsterdam is Oosterdok
Zip-code 1011 VX (near the Science Center: 'Nemo', Oosterdok 2).**

On foot

At Central Station take exit "centrum", and then turn left, walk straight on 1,2 km/0.75 miles. Cross the bridge (only for cyclists and pedestrians). It takes about 10 to 15 minutes. Follow the red line on this map.

Train

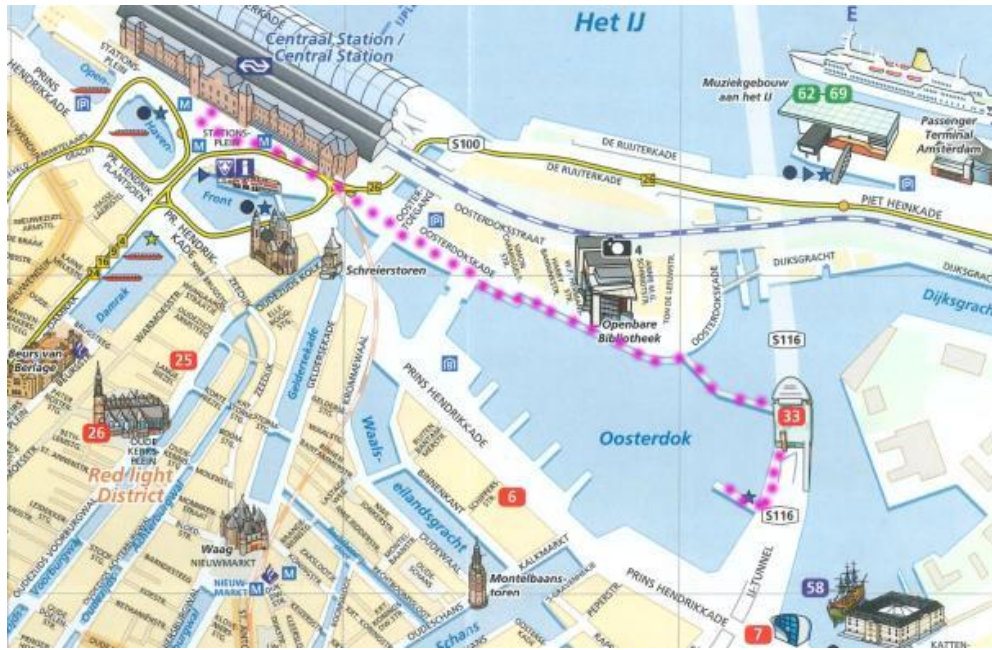
There is a direct train that leaves 6 times per hour from Schiphol Airport to Amsterdam Central Station. It takes about 16 minutes. The price for a train ticket Schiphol-Amsterdam is € 4,00 per person for a single journey.

Taxi

A taxi from Schiphol Amsterdam Airport to the barge in Amsterdam takes about 30 minutes. It costs about € 50 you can call the following company: Taxi Direct 0031 (0) 20 6333333 www.taxidirect.nl a taxi from the Central Train Station in Amsterdam to the barge takes about 5 minutes: Costs about € 10,-.

Car

If you arrive by car, we recommend you to arrive earlier to unload your luggage. You can find more information about parking possibilities at www.iamsterdam.com



GENERAL INFORMATION

Group

On board you will meet an international party of all age groups, men and women, singles, couples and families together with their children.

Travel Guidance

The crew on board your ship consists of: the skipper and his mate who are responsible for the smooth running of things on board and the cook who is in charge of the catering. A tour leader, who can assist in case of breakdowns, and who can be your guide to point out to you the things of interest along the way, accompanies the participants. He or she is multi-lingual.

Meals

In the morning a substantial cyclist's breakfast is on offer, and the evening meal consists of a dinner with tea and coffee to follow. The midday meal comprises sandwiches/fruit/ snack/drink, which you take with you from the boat after you have prepared this package yourself after breakfast. When you arrive back at the boat after the day's cycling a cup of tea or coffee with a biscuit will be waiting for you. The three-course dinner is different every day. There is a first course, main course and dessert (on the Comfort deluxe there is also an extra intermediate course). The meals on board are included in the price, as are coffee and tea. There is a bar on the boat with beer, soft drinks and wine at reasonable prices.
